




# COYOTES LIVE HERE

Coyotes have lived in this area for a long time and generally mind their own business. Coyotes are about 25–40 pounds, generally hunt and travel alone, and tend to live in family groups made up of the parents and their offspring. Coyotes mainly eat small animals (like rodents), fruit, nuts, and food from human sources (like pet food).



SHARING OUR SPACE WITH COYOTES IS SIMPLE. FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES:



#### **REMOVE FOOD SOURCES**

Do not feed coyotes; it isn't safe for you, and it isn't safe for them.



#### SUPERVISE YOUR PETS

Keep cats and small dogs indoors, supervised, or leashed.



## IF YOU SEE A BOLD COYOTE, SCARE IT AWAY

A coyote that is comfortable with people is more likely to cause conflict. Try clapping, blowing a whistle, or yelling.



### **REPORT YOUR SIGHTINGS**
